Cult Film Club at the Central Library

The Central Children's library had a successful Doors Open London day on Sept. 20 with 93 participants. Kids enjoyed a fun and engaging day filled with music-related activities, starting with hands-on exploration of a world instruments display. Our Digital Literacy facilitator featured music related iPad games and Ozmo activities in the TD program room. Music activities were also held in the newly renovated Rotary Reading Garden.

Our creative labs welcomed over 60 visitors to create digital recordings, take photos with our green screen, and make buttons.

Dress for Success with ClothingWorks at the Central Library

On September 15th, 11 patrons attended our first Dress for Success program.
